Just For Fun: Read Jude 1:14-15, Read Enoch 1:9

Enoch 1:9 - And behold! He cometh with ten thousands of His holy ones to execute judgement upon all, and to destroy all the ungodly: And to convict all flesh Of all the works of their ungodliness which they have ungodly committed, and of all the hard things which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him."

What is Jude talking about in the story of Enoch?

If Jude uses Enoch as commentary and a source for his argument, should we know this book, why or why not?

Application

How are you actively waiting for God?

When actively waiting for a baby, we get a room ready, prepare, get needed supplies, and so on...

"keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life." --Jude 1:21

This verse encourages believers to actively and faithfully look forward to the fulfillment of Christ's promises, emphasizing a vigilant and expectant state of hope.

The Greek word προσδέχομαι (prosdechomai), meaning "to wait for" or "to eagerly expect," is used in various places in the New Testament. It often conveys a sense of active waiting and anticipation for God's actions, promises, or fulfillment.
